### **Special packages released for Blue Mountains rainforest sculpture extravaganza**

A mammoth metal bird, 1500 ceramic flowers and a 90kg chandelier are among 26 exclusive sculptures that will transform the Blue Mountains ancient rainforest next week into one of the world's most spectacular art galleries for the inaugural *Sculpture at Scenic World*.

This major cultural event, between 16 February and 11 March 2012, is expected to attract more than 60,000 people to Australia's most visited privately-owned tourist attraction, Scenic World.

Visitors will travel down the world's steepest railway to reach the Jamison Valley floor and view sculptures by 27 artists selected from Belfast to Katoomba. Their sculptures will be judged for the \$20,000 Scenic World Acquisitive Award, for artwork never exhibited before.

Australia's only dedicated rainforest sculpture exhibition features a dynamic program of guided and independent tours, lectures and a discussion panel.

Scenic World Managing Directors, Anthea and David Hammon said the attraction had just launched a series of packages to make this exhibition accessible to all.

*Sculpture at Scenic World* is free with every Scenic Railway ticket. Special exhibition packages are:

#### **Unlimited Exhibition Pass - \$49**

Unlimited entry for the duration of the exhibition including all rides, all Exhibition Public Programmes - tours, artist talks and lectures, plus Exhibition Map.

#### **Scenic Sculpture + Map - \$32**

Valley return ticket on either the Railway or Cableway, return trip on the Skyway, Exhibition Map, PLUS free entry to the Exhibition.

### **Scenic Sculpture - \$28**

Valley return ticket on either the Railway or Cableway, return trip on the Skyway, plus free entry into the Exhibition.

### **Sculpture Valley - \$21**

Valley return ticket on either the Railway or Cableway, PLUS free entry into the Exhibition.

\* Family passes are also available.

Along with the Scenic Railway, Scenic World has the highest Skyway in Australia at 270m, the biggest cable car in the country fitting 84 people, and the Scenic Walkway where the exhibition is being staged, which is the longest boardwalk in the Southern Hemisphere spanning 2.4km.
