An Easter Bunny hunt, hungry plants and Sculpture for Small People at Scenic World this Easter school holidays

Hunt for the Easter Bunny in ancient Blue Mountains' rainforest, feed carnivorous plants beneath Jurassic ferns, and create art inspired by the landscape as part of Scenic World's April school holiday program.

Catch the world's steepest railway at 52 degrees down to the Jamison Valley floor to set lobster pot and fly traps as part of the free *Curiously Carnivorous* show. Pat some farmyard friends on the forecourt, grab a hot cross bun from the pop-up café for fuel, and follow the self-guided mystery Easter Bunny trail.

This year Scenic World's exciting Easter program has been developed using the talents of staff, including the *Curiously Carnivorous* shows presented by budding botanist and team member Murray Clark, who will take children on an interactive adventure of seven species of carnivorous plant.

There's also a dedicated Easter *Farmyard Friends* enclosure where children can pat and feed rabbits, piglets, chicks, calves, and ducklings.

The fun continues after Easter with the hugely popular *Sculpture for Small People* workshops led by exhibiting artists of this year's *Sculpture at Scenic World* exhibition, from 24 April until 18 May 2014.

Scenic World's Joint Managing Directors, David and Anthea Hammon, said Easter at the attraction had been a very special time throughout their childhood.

"Scenic World has always been owned by our family and became the backdrop of many memorable experiences over the holidays. Our Easter program is a way of sharing our happy experiences with visiting families so they can create their own unforgettable memories," they said.

Key holiday program dates:

- *Curiously Carnivorous*: daily from 14–17 April at 10.30am and 1.30pm
- *Farmyard Friends*: April 18 (Good Friday) – Easter Monday 21 April, between 11am and 3pm
- *Easter Bunny Trail* – Sunday 20 April between 9am and 11am

- *Sculpture for Small People* – throughout *Sculpture at Scenic World*, between 24 April and 19 May (www.scenicworld.com.au/sculpture)

All Easter Weekend events are free with the purchase of an entry ticket to Scenic World. Tickets cost \$88 for a family of two adults and up to five children, \$35 per adult, \$18 for children (4-13yrs), and \$32 for concession holders, including unlimited rides on the Scenic Railway, Skyway, Cableway and Walkway.

There is also an Annual Pass for families at \$239, for two adults and up to five children under 13. The pass entitles visitors to unlimited rides all day, every day of the year, 15% off additional tickets, food and beverage, and retail purchases.
