World class artworks in a world renowned rainforest to be unveiled next week at Sculpture at Scenic World 2015

The ancient Blue Mountains rainforest will become an outdoor art gallery next Wednesday 15 April, when 31 sculptures from around the world are unveiled at Sculpture at Scenic World 2015.

After two weeks of delicate installation with each sculpture being transported down the Scenic Cableway at Scenic World, artworks have been curated for the Jurassic setting along the sculpture trail for public viewing until 10 May 2015.

Now in its fourth year, Sculpture at Scenic World will feature artists from Germany, Finland, New Zealand, and Japan, alongside Australian artists from Queensland, Victoria, Western Australia, Tasmania, Australian Capital Territory and New South Wales.

Visitors can take part in the public program designed for children, families and art appreciators. There are artist lead workshops for children as part of the popular Sculpture for Small People series – every Saturday and Sunday. Each Friday and Saturday you can meet the exhibitors at Artists Talks including the \$20,000 Scenic World Award winner, and there are free guided tours daily.

Other highlights of the program are:

- ***metalheads*** – the Sculpture Projects initiative showcasing a diverse array of sculpture from the metal arts on display at Scenic World, The Carrington Hotel, and the Blue Mountains Cultural Centre.
- **Sculpture Otherwise** – An exhibition by the participating artists of Sculpture at Scenic World, held at the Blue Mountains Cultural Centre.

Visitors can also test their creative side by uploading a photo of their favourite artwork and #scenicssculpture or simply vote for their favourite artwork onsite in the People's Choice Award to go in the draw to win an ipad mini.
